#### Ebbw Fawr sets new standards for Blaenau Gwent



Ebbw Fawr Learning Community's examination results at GCSE level have been praised by its Director Graeme Harkness. Speaking to over 170 staff on the eve of students returning for the new academic year he congratulated them on the improvement in educational performance over the last two years.

Mr Harkness said "The improvement in outcomes over the last two years is down to hardworking and dedicated staff, supportive parents and fantastic students. Our GCSE results this year for 5 A\*-C grades including English and Mathematics topped 53%, two years ago the result for the combined previous schools that closed was 39%."

Mr Harkness also spoke to staff about improvements in results at Key Stage 2 and 3 this year coupled with year on year increases in student attendance in both primary and secondary phases and in the national literacy and numeracy tests. He also praised six students who gained 'A' levels a full two years early. Students returning to the secondary phase will also see





improvements in the building as the school and Council have taken advantage of the long holiday to complete work left over from last year. Secondary Phase Director Phil Collins explained

"We have taken advantage of the long holiday to undertake work that needed full access to the building, students will benefit from a doubling of the "grab and go" dining area, improved internet access throughout and enhanced main corridor facilities. The building looks truly fantastic."

#### Could you be our next Governor?



School governors have overall responsibility for the conduct of their school and within that particular responsibilities to promote high standards of education and the welfare of students. All of this is contained in a legal framework. Being a governor is both rewarding and challenging and requires commitment to attend meetings and fully participate in the life of the school.

A governor is someone who:-

- is a volunteer; cares about teaching, learning and children;
- represents those people with a key interest in the school, including parents, staff, the local community and the LEA;
- is part of a team which accepts responsibility for everything a school does;
- has time to commit to meetings and other occasions when needed;

- is able to act as a friend who supports the school but is still able to cast a critical eye upon how the school works and the standard it achieves;
- acts as a link between parents, the local community, the LEA and the school.

Community Governors are invited by other governors to join the governing body and are appointed by the governing body. #### School attendance

Improving school attendance is a priority for Blaenau Gwent Council as poor school attendance can have a hugely negative impact on the lives and futures of children and young people. This is especially worrying for pupils in Blaenau Gwent where attendance rates, though improving, are still below the Welsh average.

The purpose of this letter is to make all parents and carers aware of an important change that has been brought in as a result of new legislation. In September 2013 Welsh Government introduced the use of Fixed Penalty Notices as an early intervention tool to improve attendance. From 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014 these will now be fully operational in Blaenau Gwent and may be issued as a result of:

- Taking holidays in term time
- Unauthorised absence
- Persistent late arrival at school
- Truancy

The cost of a fixed penalty notice will be £60 per parent per child if paid within 28 days. This rises to £120 per parent if not paid within 28 days. Failure to pay this within 42 days will result in prosecution.

There is no right of appeal but anyone who has been issued with a fixed penalty notice can put any concerns in writing to the Education Welfare Service, Anvil Court, Abertillery, NP13 1DB or have their case heard in the Magistrates Court.

I trust that you share our commitment to all children and young people being entitled to the best education possible and, to this end, ensure that your child achieves the highest possible level of attendance while she/he is at school.
