During an hour long visit Education & Skills Minister Huw Lewis AM, met students who have represented Wales in a variety of sports, discussed the school's progress since opening with student Ambassadors and learnt a little of the history of the Works site from staff who now work for the school, but previously held posts on the site.

Earlier in the year we briefed the Minister on the developments the school has made to engage more with parents this year through such activities as "Chat", parental forums, drop – in sessions for skill developments and consultation events around literacy and numeracy.

As part of the visit the Minister was pleased to help us launch an Ebbw Fawr 'app' which can be down loaded to tablets, ipads and smart phones. The app links directly to our website, but also allows us to push notifications directly to parents around events in the school, or notifications if issues exist around weather or transport.

improve engagement between the school, pupils, parents and the wider community and demonstrates how we are working hard to improve the life chances of our learners ".

These groups are held weekly, and they provide a safe place to share needs, feelings and thoughts.

Support is provided to work through any concerns in our lives.

Problems can range from low feelings of self-worth, unhealthy relationships, concern for the use of drugs and alcohol by self and others. The aim is to identify these self-defeating behaviours and reduce feelings of isolation and loneliness, raising self- esteem.




SEAL (Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning).

Welsh Baccalaureate annual visit to London and the Houses of Parliament

The very popular Welsh Baccalaureate annual visit to London and the Houses of Parliament took place earlier this year. The busy weekend of activities began with a visit to the 4D cinema to experience a birds -eye view over the City of London, this was just the start of what was to come. The pupils still overcome by their vertigo embarked the London Eye for a 45-minute flight. Here they experienced the "real" views of the Capital City where plenty of snapshots were taken to record their experiences.

Following our landing we disembarked and took a quick dash over to Portcullis House where we were met by our hosts from Parliament Education UK for a guided tour of the Houses of Parliament. Our luck was in, we were fortunate to actually sit in the gallery to observe debate in action within the House of Commons – www.parliamentlive.tv. Before our pupils could join in the debate we whipped them off to



continue the historical tour around Parliament. Whilst wandering around Westminster Hall we were approached by a familiar face - Nick Smith, the MP for Blaenau Gwent spotted us and grabbed an opportunity for a photo-shoot under "Big Ben" before leaving us briefly to complete our tour. Two workshops followed that were designed to support the teaching of Wales, Europe & the World – Politics "Elections & Voting" and "Making Laws". These activities enabled the pupils to participate in mock elections and role-play, of which they all thoroughly enjoyed and were wholly engaged. Nick Smith made his re-appearance where he introduced himself to the group and gave a detailed summary of his roles

and responsibilities of being a Member of Parliament; this was then concluded with question and answer session and group photography.

Foundation phase gardening club.



The children from the foundation phase have been working very in the after school gardening club. Over the last couple of weeks they have made hanging baskets, planted strawberries, peas and runner beans. The runner beans were grown by the pupils in Miss Griffith's and Miss Bowen's class and then the gardening club planted them in the raised beds.
