





- 8 cases went to court between September 2014 July 2015 with an additional case still pending for a new hearing date for September 2015.
- All 8 cases received a fine or an order, resulting the cost up to September 2015 £2399.
- Fixed penalty letters for (FPN) issued to all parents who have taken holidays with an Attendance below 95%.
- 2 parents have received a fine of £65.
- Late letters have also been issued to parents by the school and EWS for pupils above 10 sessions.
- Additional letters have also been sent for attendance for below 85% and illness.

Due to the new system Callio being embedded, cases below 80% will be referred to the EWS service by completion of a new referral form, by a member of staff. The EWO, School Callio Champion and Pastoral team are working closely together to address issues and track each year group attendance on a fortnightly bases
