Students EU Referendum Vote



As part of an on-going oracy project being undertaken at EFLC, students are expected to discuss and offer educated views on current affairs issues. Over the last half term students have been discussing the political issues surrounding the EU Referendum and on Thursday 23 June the students all voted in their own school referendum.

In contrast to the actual referendum results, our students voted to remain in the European Union and many students were keen to discuss their reasons why too. One student said "I think we should vote 'in' because I think remaining in the EU will mean we have more national financial security and also it will mean that more money gets distributed to valleys communities like Ebbw Vale. EU funding has helped us build our school, the college, the hospital and the railway renovations. We have been very fortunate. I want that to continue."

The final results of the school referendum vote were 51% to remain 'in' the European Union and 49% to 'leave' the European Union.

Students are looking forward to discussing more political and current issues during their 'oracy time' and staff are intrigued to hear the articulate and passionate opinions of our students.

Super Curriculum Lessons!

KS3 students in the Learning Resource Base (LRB) have been enjoying their latest super curriculum lessons! Students have recently been exploring the theme of Super Heroes.

They begun by exploring the different characteristics of their favourite Super Heroes (Batman, Superman, Ironman, Supergirl) and Super Villains (The Joker, Bane, Lex Luthor, Dr. Octopus) with a view to developing their knowledge and understanding of why people all over the world enjoy films and comics about Super Heroes so much!

The students followed this up by studying the work of some real life cartoonists and their comic book creations. They looked at famous works by Walt Disney (creator of Mickey Mouse) and Stan Lee (creator of SpiderMan) with a view to completing their very own comic books, based on Super Heroes of their own creation!

After completing their very own Super Hero comic books, the students then used their presenting skills they have been working hard on this year to present their finished products to the rest of their class. The KS3 students of the LRB have thoroughly enjoyed these curriculum lessons, which has been evident in the enthusiasm they have shown throughout, and can be seen in the fantastic work they have all produced.

KS4 students in the Learning Resource Base (LRB) have been hard at work in their efforts to achieve their BTEC Level 1 Certificate in Personal & Social Development (PSD).

This is part of their Sweet

(Succeeding with Education Employment and Training) qualification, which sees the students working on topics such as, Personal Identity, Managing Relationships, Healthy Living, Moving Forward, Money Matters, Enterprise and Employability, Global Citizenship, and Community.

Most recently the students have been focusing on 'Preparation for Work' and 'Skills for Employment'. This has involved the students performing research on what is meant by the terms 'Qualities', 'Attitude', and 'Skills employers want or need'. They have researched the local job market, finding a selection of jobs they feel would be best suited to them. They have then successfully composed their CVs. After researching possible interview questions and how best to answer them, the students then took part in a mock interview (for the role of



supermarket cashier). The KS4 students have been studying this Unit in an effort to recognise and develop the skills they will need to reach their full potential, by looking at the skills, qualities and attitudes they will need to achieve their career goals.

Language & Cultural Awareness Trip - Paris
